Call for candidates for a full-time position of an IT for 12 months in the Faculty of History, University of Warsaw for the research project NAWA – Profesura Gościnna: "Places, People and Events: Innovative Spatial Humanities Research to support Interpretation and Explanation", duration of the project: 2021-2024; principal investigator Prof. Dr. Francis Harvey

12 months (15th February 2022 – 14th February 2023)

Name of the position:

IT person (technical-engineering position) (there is a possibility to negotiate the time of employment, a part of tenure, working hours and the form of work: in the faculty or remotely)

Scope of work in the project:

The University of Warsaw, Faculty of History, invites applications for this position in a digital humanities research group led by Prof. Dr. Francis Harvey. This position is one of four that are part of a three and one-half year research project, People, Places and Events (PPE) that develops new approaches using graph-databases to support historical geography research. The project will produce one toolkit to support interpretative analytical research and a second toolkit to create interactive visualisations. Interest and contributions to a dynamic interdisciplinary research group through an active education program, broad and academic outreach are central to the group's work. The research group is looking for individuals with a desire to take bold steps and advance digital humanities research through the integration of graphDB, data visualisation, semantic modelling, geographic representation and historical quantitative and qualitative methods. Project work heavily involves open source software including Gephi, CATMA and QGIS, Nodegoat and the graph database software Neo4j to develop a prototype integrated environment for visual interpretation, analysis of historical and geographical information and support both toolkits. We will also use the software Nodegoat. Part of project work includes involvement in outreach and training activities including workshops and publications. Positions, based on future possibilities, can also involve European and other international travel.

Expectations:

- Graph database implementation, interface development and main toolkit development
- Requires IT programming, web development skills and experience in administering spatial historical data.

Desired:

- Experience with software, programming languages and the web-development stack created for this project
- Tasks include graph database installation and management, server support with UW-IT, data administration, development and maintenance of the project software stack and toolkits, support of workshops and research for publications
- Ability to conduct research in the project field and communicate its results;
- Ability and will to work in a team, share research results, timeliness.

Selection procedure

Application deadline: 10th January 2022 Application results: by 17th January 2022

The application process is conducted by the hiring committee in accordance with the regulations of the University of Warsaw, Faculty of History. Shortlisted candidates may be invited for an interview, which will be conducted digitally between 11th and 17th January 2022.

Candidates will be informed of the results via e-mail or phone. The application process is only the first stage of the employment procedure as defined by the Statute of the University of Warsaw. A successful application is the basis for further proceedings.

Beginning of employment is planned for 15th February 2022.

Required documents:

The DPO, however, does not proceed other matters, like handling recruitment procedures, collecting recruitment documents, providing information on current recruitment process.

Purpose and legal grounds of data processing

Personal data of candidates for employment shall be processed for recruitment purposes only.

Your personal data shall be processed in the scope as indicated by employment law¹ (given name (names) and family name, date of birth, contact information as provided, education, professional qualifications, previous employment) for the purposes of this recruitment process ², whereas other data³ shall be processed based on your consent which may take the following wording:

I agree to the processing of personal data provided in (e.g. CV, cover letter, and other submitted documents) by the University of Warsaw for realising my recruitment process.

If your documents include data as mentioned in Art. 9 section 1 of the GDPR (special categories of personal data), processing shall be possible upon your consent to processing such data⁴, which may take the following wording:

I agree to the processing of special categories of personal data, as mentioned in Art. 9 section 1 of the GDPR, provided in (e.g. CV, cover letter, and other submitted documents) by the University of Warsaw for realising my recruitment process.

The University of Warsaw shall be also processing your personal data in future recruitment processes upon your consent⁵, which may take the following wording:

I consent to processing of my personal data for the purposes of any future recruitment processes at the University of Warsaw for the period of the next nine months.

You may revoke all such consents at any time by, for example, sending an email at sekretariat.ih@uw.edu.pl.

Be advised that the revocation of your consent does not affect legal compliance of processing which had been completed upon consent before its revocation.⁶

Data retention period

Your personal data collected in this recruitment process shall be stored over the period of three months from the date the recruitment process is completed.

In case you agree to process your data in future recruitments, your data shall be used over the period of nine months.

Data recipients

Officers authorized by the Controller shall have access to your personal data, the processing of which is in the scope of their duties.

Data transfer outside the European Economic Area (EEA)

Your personal data shall be disclosed to subjects authorized by law. Signing-in is through Google Forms. Your personal data may be also processed by our provider of G-Suit for education by Google Company in their data processing centres. Your data shall be protected under the standards of the Privacy Shield, accepted by the European Commission. This shall guarantee an adequate level of data security.

Rights of the data subject

Under the GDPR data subjects have the following rights:

- to access data and to receive copies of the actual data;
- to correct (rectify) your personal data;
- to restrict processing of personal data;
- to erase personal data, subject to provisions of Art. 17 section 3 of the GDPR;
- to file a claim with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office, if you believe data processing violates law.

Information on the requirement to provide data

Providing your personal data in the scope resulting from law is necessary to participate in the recruitment process. Providing other personal data is voluntary.
